Cygnet learning Autumn 2023 **Knights and Castles**

<u>English</u>

We will be learning to write our adventure stories with story maps, setting and character descriptions based on the story The Kiss that Missed by David Melling and looking at non-fiction texts about Castles. We will be using our phonics scheme,

Little Wandle, to help us with our writing and spelling. You will have weekly spellings to learn to spell common exception words.

We will be discovering the different sentence Types- statement, question and command.

We will be working very hard on the presentation of our handwriting, with Year 2 children starting their writing from the line.



Maths

We will start the half term looking at place value with number to 10, 20 and beyond. We will then be learning about addition and subtraction, recording number sentences and problem solving.

Please help at home by practicing counting in 2's, 5's and 10's and talking about the value of different coins.

To further support your child's maths learning at home please help them to develop their rapid recall of key maths facts, such as number bonds to ten and fact families using the White Rose Maths App

Religious Education

We will be exploring the idea of what God is like by hearing the parable of the lost son and thinking of God as a father. We will then explore why Christians perform Nativity plays at Christmas.

P.E. lessons with Premier sport will take place each **Thursday** morning. Children will need to have their PE kits in school, in a draw string PE bag, everyday.







History

We will be visiting Arundel Castle to explore our key question- who lives here?

We will be learning about Castles, what they do and people who lived there. .

You can help your child by looking at nonfiction books about castles and Arundel..



<u>Science</u>

We will be exploring everyday materials. We will be identifying and naming materials and thinking about their properties and what makes them suitable for their jobs. We will keep looking outside to see how the seasons are changing.



Art/DT

We will be looking at observational drawing and using different media to draw Arundel castle.

In Design Technology, we will be looking at wheels and axles and designing a vehicle to move.

It is essential that your child fully **understands** the text they are reading and becomes familiar with **new vocabulary**. Please also try and read to your child as often as possible as this helps to develop their vocabulary, understanding of different stories, text types and helps to instil a love of reading. This is **vital** for children to progress across the whole curriculum.
